Sightseeing and attractions are all over the island, from iconic bridges to ancient burial chambers, spectacular cliff-top views to works of art. Known as "Môn Mam Cymru" - Anglesey, mother of Wales, the island was always a prolific producer of fruit, vegetables and meat, and, to this day, restaurants still use locally sourced produce. There is a vineyard in the south of the island, a brewery in the west and a cider manufacturer in the middle, so plenty of opportunity to say *iechyd da* when celebrating your drive.
